EXTEMPORANEOUS COMPOUND GUIDELINES

In Table 1 classifying simple versus complex compounding, the example given for simple capsules, tablets and powders was incorrect. It should have been boric acid capsules (not ethinylestradiol capsules, which are an example of complex compounding).

Extemporaneously compounded medicines - Australian Prescriber

Extemporaneously compounded medicines may be useful when a required dose or dose form is unavailable commercially, or for individualised dosing. There are numerous established compounding formulae available, and new formulae may be developed with the help of formulation guidelines and professional advice.

Extemporaneously compounded medicines

Extemporaneous compounding increases the risk of error that could harm the patient through overdosing or underdosing. Using a commercial preparation reduces the risk by removing compounding error. However, in many instances proprietary oral liquids are not available and extemporaneous compounding is unavoidable.

General guidance for compounding oral liquids

(Where a manufacturer's instructions are not followed, for example a different diluent is used, this is considered compounding.) Interpretation of the basic GMP requirements Where a clause number or an Annex is not listed, there is no specific interpretation provided for manufacture of extemporaneously compounded products.

Guidelines for Compounding Practices. Compounding is an integral part of pharmacy practice and is essential to the provision of health care. Compounding is defined in several ways; one definition in Chapter 795 of the United States Pharmacopeia (USP 795) is as follows: The preparation, mixing, assembling, altering, packaging, and labeling of a drug, drug-delivery device, or device in accordance with a licensed practitioner's prescription, medication order, or initiative based on the ...

Guidelines for Compounding Practices

Personnel engaged in compounding maintain good and disposed of in a sanitary and timely manner and in hand hygiene and wear clean clothing appropriate to accordance with local, state, and federal guidelines. The type of compounding performed (e.g., hair bonnets, The entire compounding and storage area should be well lit, coats, gowns, gloves, facemasks, shoes, aprons, etc.

795 PHARMACEUTICAL COMPOUNDING—NONSTERILE PREPARATIONS

Basic guidelines should be provided that include staff training to assure use of proper aseptic technique, proper preparation of the compounding area prior to mixing, and labeling of all items prepared. Periodic competency assessments should be performed.

The data is then provided to the Compounding Expert Committee for analysis, further development, and approval. Once approved, the CPM is published in the USP-NF. Compounding Experts. Although there is a high degree of variation in the compounding policies across Member States, allowing extemporaneous pharmacy preparations when there is no licensed medicinal product available on the market is a common practice in order to ensure patient care (Scheepers et al, Legislation on the preparation of medicinal products in European pharmacies and the Council of Europe Resolution, European Journal of Hospital Pharmacy, Vol. 24 (4), July 2017).
