The Writing Process: A Scaffolding Approach Considerations ...

Most research in writing pedagogy today concludes that the most effective way to teach writing is through a process approach. This approach assumes that a writer needs to be writing for authentic purposes in an extended process that includes prewriting, writing, revising, and editing--though these are done in a recursive manner rather than in discrete steps.

The Process Approach

Four Critical Components of an Effective Writing-Process Approach to Teaching Written Expression: TIME ¼Students need to write often and regularly (at least 4 days per week for 60 minutes). ¼Students need opportunities for sustained writing. ¼There should be a balance of time spent in secretary role

Teaching Writing: A Process Approach

The process approach treats all writing as a creative act which requires time and positive feedback to be done well. In process writing, the teacher moves away from being someone who sets students a writing topic and receives the finished product for correction without any intervention in the writing process itself.

Abstract The process writing approach treats writing not as a completed product but as a process. Writing studies are carried out as a part of the process before the written text is completed. This approach focuses on the student in writing lessons, and the teacher only acts as a guide.

Process approaches to writing tend to focus more on the varied classroom activities which promote the development of language use: brainstorming, group discussion, re-writing. A process approach to writing would comprise a set of planned learning instructions that aims to familiarize students with the processes involved in writing, mainly planning, drafting, revising and editing (Seow 2002), emphasizing teacher modeling at each stage.
